



Discipline Policy

Following the Honour Code leads to the development of a civil society that strives towards common behaviour which enables constituents to live and work together in a supportive and nurturing fashion. The College's discipline policy concerns itself with behaviour that runs contrary to the Honour Code, and describes the explanation of the consequences incurred by this behaviour.

The policy was drawn up democratically following a questionnaire to all stakeholders – parents, staff and learners. This questionnaire determined which aspects of generally accepted disciplinary actions were necessary at Penryn. This policy in its entirety follows closely the requirements of the South African Schools Act and the Labour Relations Act, to ensure that the national laws of justice are adhered to.

Except in severe cases where single acts of contravention can lead to expulsion (following a disciplinary hearing), all disciplinary procedures and consequences are aimed at enabling the individual learner to correct their behaviour and continue at Penryn in a meaningful and effective way.

The full disciplinary policy is issued to all new learners and parents at the school and is in turned signed for to indicate understanding and acceptance of its procedures and consequences.

The full policy is available in full at the front desk for anyone to examine it.
